Bayonne, Mel-Lin told to pay Du Pont

NEW YORK (FNS) — Du Pont has been granted federal court judgments totaling \$248,000 in its suits charging Bayonne Fashions, Inc., and Mel-Lin Lingerie with falsely labeling daywear with Du Pont's Antron trademark.

A similar suit against Schnur & Cohan, Inc., is pending before Judge John M. Canella.

In the judgments issued by Judge Robert L. Carter, Bayonne was ordered to pay \$105,000 and Mel-lin, \$143,000.

and Mel-Lin Lingerie entered into a consent
judgment under which they
agreed, without admitting
any liability, to pay Du
Pont a total of \$248,000 to
end an infringement suit
over the Antron III trademark. A story on page 23,
Aug. 20, did not say that the
judgment was agreed to by
the parties.

Attorneys for Bayonne and Mel-Lin said their clients considered the amount they agreed to pay represented the approximate amount of legal fees that would have incurred if the case went to trial.

Court papers show that the two firms have named Manis & Singer, Inc., and Crystal Fabrics, as third party defendants on the belief they caused the legal problems. N
